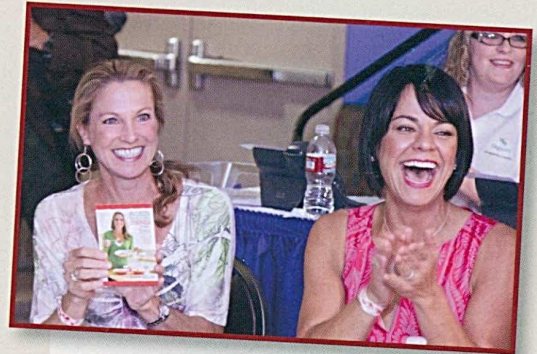
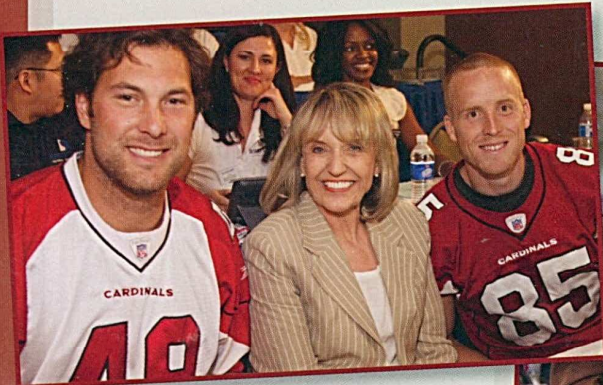


### 12 NEWS GIVES TO KIDS

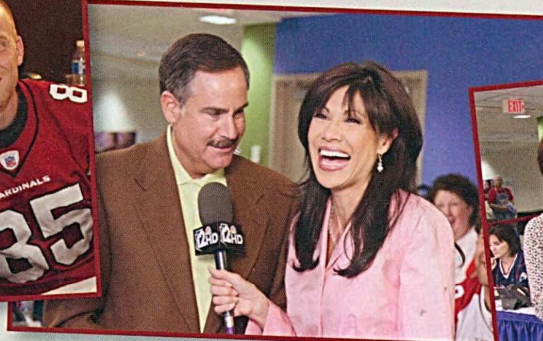

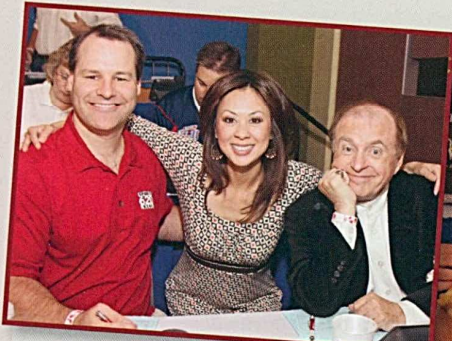
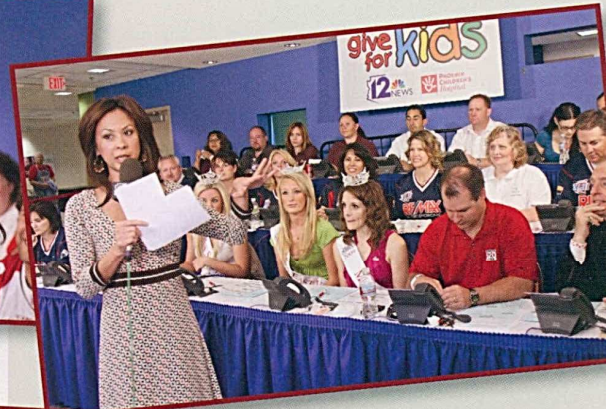
Ali Vincent (right), first female winner of NBC's "The Biggest Loser" with Robin Miller (left) of the Food Network.



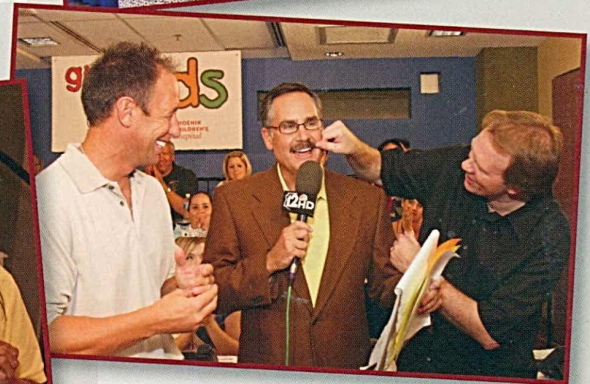

### HYUNDAI SETS WHEELS IN MOTION

Hyundai brought hope to Phoenix Children's in a Sante Fe. It's Hyundai's Hope on Wheels – a united effort of Hyundai's nearly 800 dealers, in partnership with Hyundai Motor America. The program supports children battling pediatric cancer and the doctors and researchers working to eradicate the disease. Dr. Amy Rosenfeld, a Phoenix Children's neuro-oncologist was named a 2009 Hyundai Scholar, and will use this year's donation of \$40,000 to support pediatric brain tumor research.
